In this course we will first get acquainted with basic semantic notions like the difference between sense and reference (e.g. the German chancellor vs. Angela Merkel), semantic classes of verbs/predicates, tense, aspect and modality. In the end we will be able to theoretically explain, for instance, why the English progressive is compatible with some verbs, but not with others: compare "John is driving a car" with "*John is owning a car". In addition, we will set the grounds for a formal approach to natural language semantics by determining the kind of objects words may refer to and how we can combine them to derive the interpretation of sentences. For this, we will introduce and make use of basic notions of set theory and predicate logic.

The aim of this seminar is to learn how to think syntactically. After reviewing your syntactic knowledge from previous courses, we will see how we can argue for or against a given syntactic model. We will be looking at how Government and Binding (GB) has dealt with certain syntactic phenomena, and we will then see how these phenomena can be accounted for in a minimalist framework. In detail, we will be dealing with binding, case, the internal structure of the NP, control vs. raising, and with a special emphasis, we will look into the internal make-up of the VP arguing for a more elaborated structure (VP, vP, VoiceP) than so far assumed.

English varies greatly both within the British Isles and across the world. The course takes a closer look at the different causes for variation within English, taking geographical, sociological and historical aspects into consideration. Different case studies on varieties of English from all over the world will be presented in detail, based on classical readings in the field of English dialectology in the widest sense. The focus is on variation in phonology.

Phonological structures are regularly studied in the context of creating lexical and occasionally morphological or sentential contrasts. However, phonetic and phonological variation can also be observed at the level of language use in human interaction: for example, in indicating politeness, or in helping guide smooth turn-taking between conversational participants. In this course, we will investigate the relationships between phonological and other linguistic mechanisms for organizing speech at the levels of discourse and interaction. We will particularly focus on the intonational marking of politeness, topic, and turn structure, considering how these features interplay with other prosodic aspects of speech, and how they vary across languages. A good knowledge of basic phonology is necessary for this course; prior knowledge of intonation and prosody is desirable.

The aim of this seminar is to make students familiar with current syntactic developments and syntactic discussion and argumentation. After introducing the core ideas of Minimalism, we will read and discuss syntactic literature on extraposition. This means that we will take a look at sentences in which a relatively heavy constituent is placed to the right of its canonical position (= it is extraposed); cf. (1) vs. (2). We will read and discuss different analyses of these constructions. Good knowledge of syntax is obligatory!

In this course, we will practice different aspects of English pronunciation that prototypically cause problems for German native speakers, and we will concentrate on the two reference varieties of English which are expected for teaching English at German schools: General American (GA) and Received Pronunciation (RP). We will approach this from a phonetic/phonological perspective (e.g., phonetic transcription, articulatory description of individual speech sounds, connected speech phenomena) in order to raise awareness for one's potential problem areas and offer some guidance as to how they might be approached.
